BEGINNER COURSE

Semester 1

The aim of the *Beginner* and *Continuing Beginner* courses is to learn to express yourself correctly in everyday situations as well as develop language skills in understanding what you hear and read. Home assignments may be set by the teacher to reinforce what is learnt in class and to assist you to develop your skills.

Oral skills are developed through listening, repeating and pronouncing words correctly as well as role playing. Aspects of Italian culture, social habits and daily life are also examined.

Course structure

The course will deal with the following communicative functions and grammatical aspects:

Term 1

- Greeting people; introducing yourself; asking and giving personal details
- Ordering in a café/restaurant
- Asking the meaning and the translation of a word
- Asking for telephone numbers

Term 2

- Introducing someone
- Asking and giving personal details
- Describing a place
- Days of the week and months
- Expressing likes and preferences

Grammatical aspects

Term 1

- Personal subject pronouns
- Indefinite and definite articles
- Gender and number of nouns
- Indicative present of the verbs *essere* and *avere*
- Simple prepositions: *di, a, in*
- Adverbs: come, dove, quando
- Negation non

Term 2

- Regular verbs in *-are, -ere, -ire*
- Indicative present of regular verbs
- Compound prepositions (e.g. *del, al, dal, nel, sul*)
- Modal verbs (volere, potere, dovere)
- The verb *piacere*
- Adjectives

Pre-requisite: there is no pre-requisite for this course. Students joining the course in Term 2 are expected to be familiar with the grammatical aspects covered in Term 1.

BEGINNER COURSE

Semester 2

- Regular verbs: present indicative verbs *sapere* and *conoscere*
- Adverbs of frequency
- The verb *piacere*
- Interrogative pronouns
- Adjectives
- Simple prepositions
- C'è and ci sono

Term 4

- Modal verbs
- Adjectives vs adverbs
- Compound prepositions
- Passato prossimo present perfect
- Irregular past participles
- Adverbs of time
- Ci vuole and ci vogliono

Pre-requisite: students joining the course this Term are expected to be familiar with the grammatical aspects covered in the previous terms.
