# INTERMEDIATE COURSE

### Semester 1

The aim of the course is to strengthen students' oral, writing and reading skills. Students will be expected to use spoken language in a variety of communication contexts; use written language to respond to spoken, written or visual text; and to respond to the content of a text whether visual, written or oral.

The classes will be conducted in Italian as far as possible to allow students to practise their listening skills. Teaching strategies include group work, pair work and whole-class activity, as appropriate.

#### **Course structure**

The course will deal with the following communicative functions:

### Term 1

- Shopping for clothes
- Making polite requests
- Expressing tastes and preferences
- Describing animals
- Talking about your childhood
- Describing past situations
- Talking about habitual activities in the past

#### Term 2

- Giving a physical description of someone
- Giving a description of someone's personality
- Making comparisons
- Describing a house
- Expressing wishes

### **Grammatical aspects**

#### Term 1

- Indirect object pronouns
- Present conditional
- The use of the *imperfetto* compared to the *passato prossimo*

# Term 2

- Passato prossimo of cominciare and finire
- Comparatives and Superlatives
- Present conditional

**Pre-requisite**: This course is designed for students who have studied at least four terms of Italian or the equivalent. Students joining the course in Term 2 are expected to be familiar with the grammatical aspects covered in Term 1.
